INDEPENDENCE DAY

July 4, 2021

In the steeple of the statehouse of an eastern city, a great bell rang out one day in 1776, summoning people to meet in the town square. Gradually, the towns people began to gather in the statehouse yard where a man stood on a platform waiting to read a proclamation to the crowd. The date was July 8, 1776. The city was Philadelphia (which was the United States' capital at the time). The meeting place is now called Independence Square, and the bell was the famous Liberty Bell. The most important American national holiday commemorates the birthday of the United States of America. It is celebrated on July 4 each year in states and possessions of the United States. On July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress declared the American Colonies free and independent from England and its king, George III. But it took the delegates two days to agree on a formal document written by Thomas Jefferson announcing their action. On July 4, the Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence. However, it was not signed on this day. Only Continental Congress President John Hancock and Secretary Charles Thompson signed the rough draft that day. The 55 other delegates had to wait almost a month for the final document to be carefully engrossed on parchment which they then signed on August 2. The founders of the new nation considered Independence Day an important occasion for rejoicing. John Adams said, "I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward for evermore."

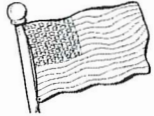

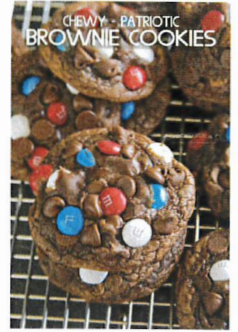

In a large mixing bowl, combine brownie mix, eggs, oil & flour. Beat until smooth.

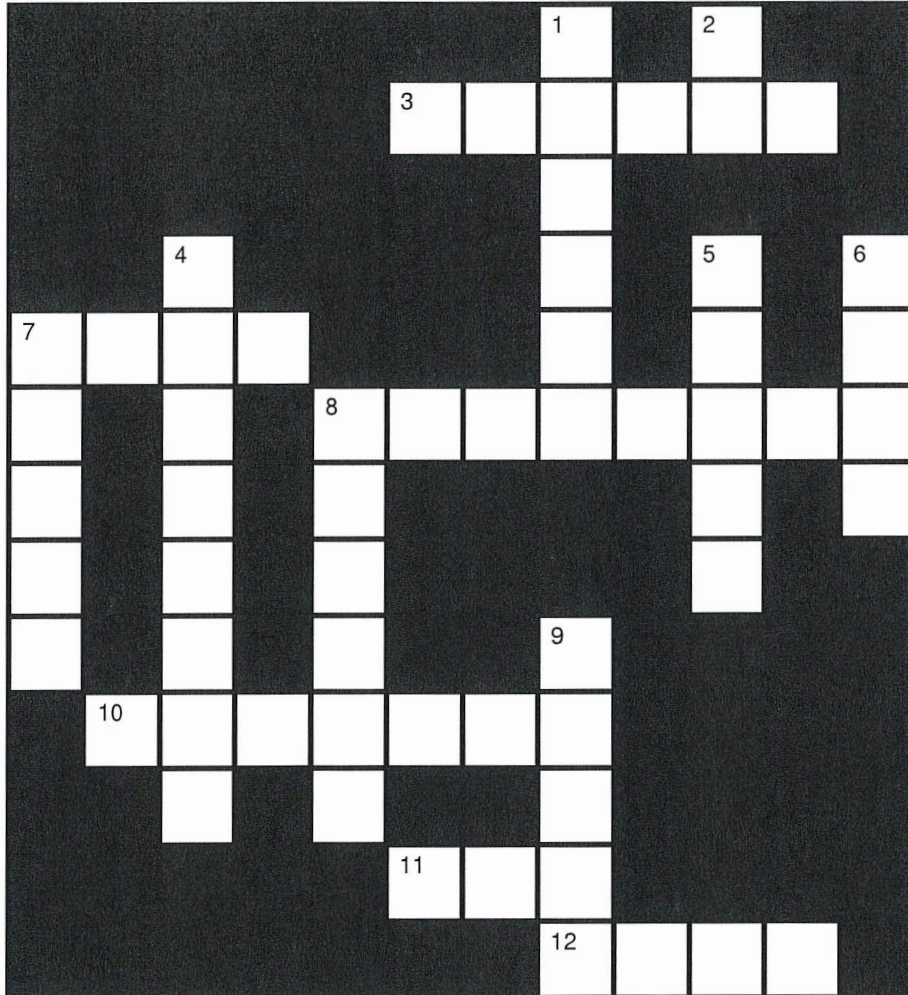
Fold in chocolate chips & 3/4 cup of the M&M's - reserving the remaining 1/4 cup for the tops of the cookies
